Convert the *absence of vehicles* to the capped objects that fall from oak trees in the autumn, sometimes leaving dents in automobiles.

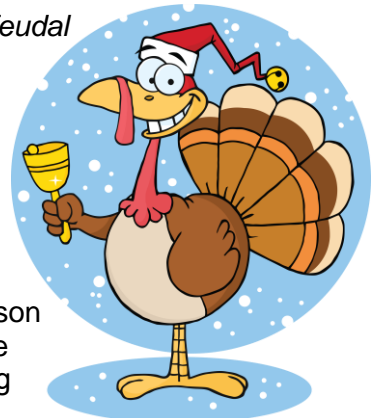
Prove that *requiring a vacation* also names the elected official who grants a pardon each Thanksgiving to one lucky turkey.
